Overview of the SELPA Local Plan

- What is a SELPA Local Plan?
 - SELPAs are required to develop and implement a comprehensive local plan containing assurances that it has in effect policies, procedures, and programs governing access to special education and services for all SWD residing within the geographic areas served by each plan. Elements of the local plan include the provision of a FAPE in the LRE, child find and referral, procedural safeguards, participation in statewide assessments, staff development programs, local administration, coordination with other public and private agencies, and management of fiscal responsibilities.

Section B: Governance and Administration

 Local Plan Section B: Governance and Administration identifies the individual responsible for the administration of the Local Plan in a single LEA SELPA. It identifies the elected officials to who the governing body or individual is responsible, as well as, the roles and responsibilities of LEA special education administrators in coordinating the administration and implementation of the plan. Local Plan Section B: Governance and Administration is the foundation of all SELPA policies, procedures, and practices for implementing special education programs within its defined geographic boundaries, and must be agreed to by its member LEAs.

Administration of Regionalized Operations and Services

Administration of Regionalized Operations and Services

• Examples and input:

- Coordinated system of identification and assessment
- Coordinated system of staff development and parent and guardian education
- Coordinated system of curriculum development and alignment with the core curriculum
- Coordinated system internal program review, evaluation of the effectiveness of the local plan, and implementation of the local plan accountability system
- Coordinated system of data collection and management
- A description of a dispute resolution process, including mediation and final and binding arbitration to resolve disputes over the distribution of funding, the responsibility for service provision, and the other governance activities specified within the local plan
- A description of the process being used to oversee and evaluate placements in nonpublic, nonsectarian schools and the method of ensuring that all requirements of each student's individualized education program are being met.
